Library news would not be complete without mention of Mrs van der Beek, the assistant Librarian, who trains the school librarians, persuades pupils to return 'lost' books, cares for the orderliness of the library, keeps the catalogue cards up to date and does a thousand other jobs which have to be done to ensure the library runs smoothly. The school library is very fortunate indeed to have such a hard working and caring person in that position.

I look forward to 1986 and to being able to continue to help you in your learning and leisure activities.

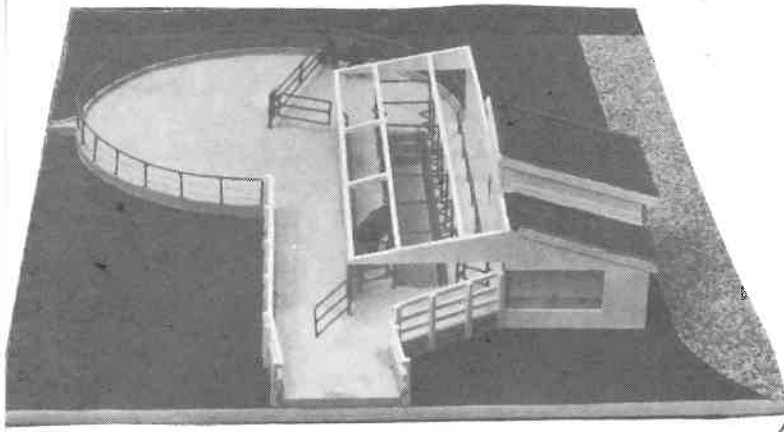

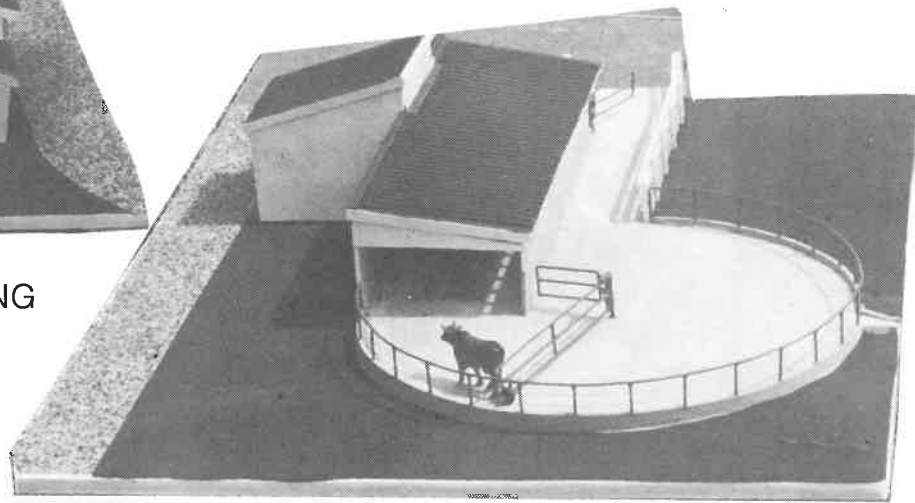

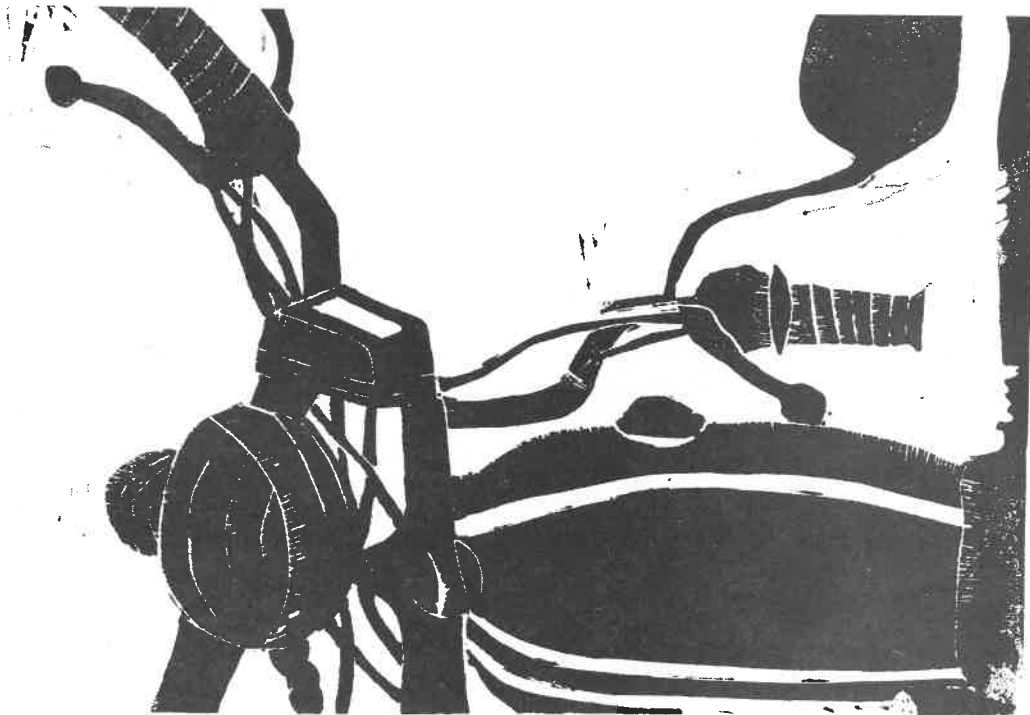
MODEL OF A HERRINGBONE MILKING

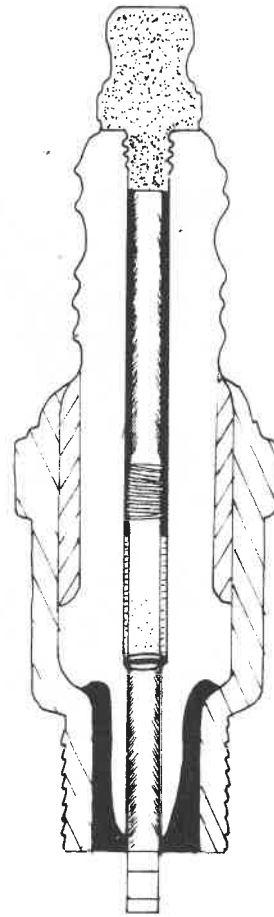
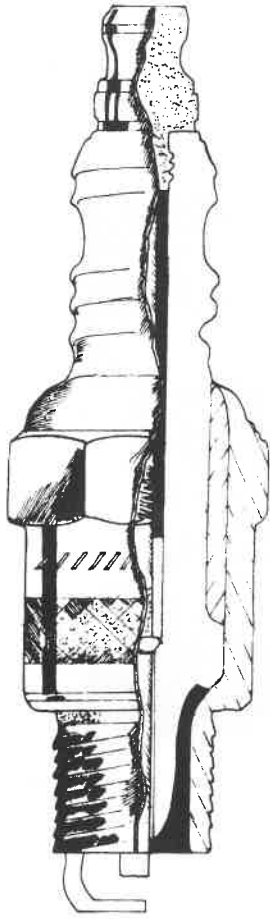

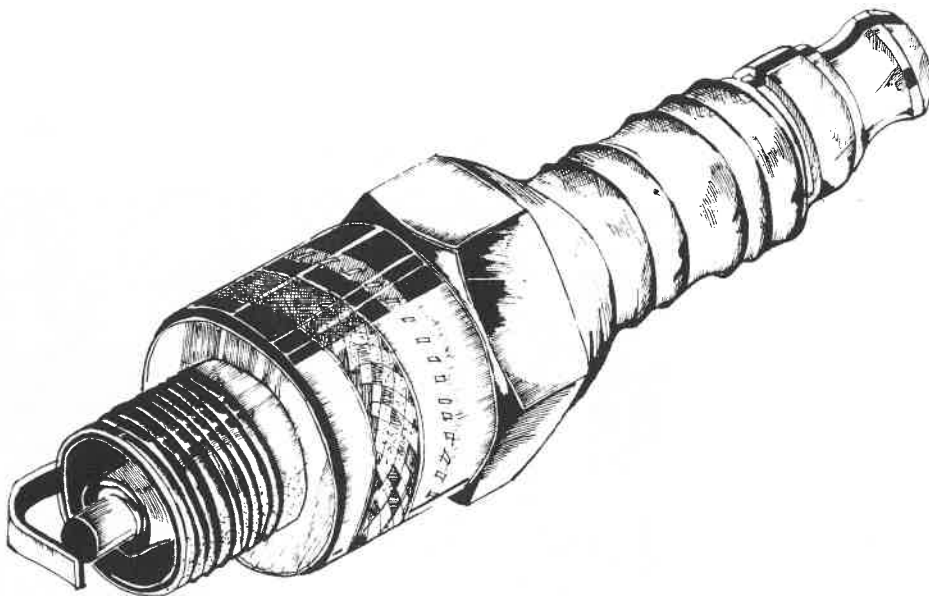
