Principals Report



I am so proud of the association that I have with the students of Forest View High School. I am excited about their state of readiness to excel in the future that beckons. It is indeed a privilege to be the Principal of Tokoroa's Forest View High School.

I thank parents and whānau for entrusting Forest View High School to educate their children. Forest View High School is determined to provide all of our students with a quality education that empowers them to become confident, actively involved, lifelong learners. In reflecting on the 2009 year, I could not help but pause to consider and appreciate the very special community of which we are part. In 2009 Forest View High School has positively and significantly contributed to the further development of what I refer to as the: "go and make it happen- ignore perceived barriers," Tokoroa approach to life.

As a member of the interviewing committee for the Board of Trustees Scholarship and the John Searle Scholarship, I gained a greater appreciation of the positive, affirmative, energetic, culturally assured, approach to life that is evident in most of our Year 13 students. In 2009 we have embraced the challenge of preparing to introduce the 2007 Revised New Zealand Curriculum in to our school, aiming to ensure that our local needs are reflected in the learning that is occurring at our school.

A challenge in implementing this new curriculum is to ensure that the values, principals, vision, and ideals that are within the curriculum are indeed shared, and that they represent what our school community believes is important. This underpins many of the other important educational initiatives that we as a school are implementing to elevate current levels of student achievement.

Student learning and student achievement is the core driver of all that we do at Forest View High School. Our 2008 NCEA achievement not only led all South Waikato Secondary schools, but compared favourably to most NCEA national benchmarks. Forest View High School is one of seventeen schools that was successful in our application to be part of the Waikato University based Te Kotahitanga project. The primary focus of the project is for teachers to adopt strategies which are aimed at raising the academic achievement of Māori students. The data from other schools in the project shows that levels of achievement improve not only for Māori students, but for all ethnic groups, and we look forward to improved levels of achievement in 2010 and beyond.

In 2009 our students also excelled on the sports fields, on the stages of performing arts, and also in participating and excelling in community events.

I particularly want to congratulate our Polinetia Fa'atasi students who have worked tirelessly to achieve their goal of travelling to Australia. They have been, and will be, excellent Forest View High School ambassadors. This experience will expand their possibility thinking and provide them with confidence to pursue unseen horizons. I especially acknowledge the teachers and whānau who have selflessly worked to enable the realisation of this lofty dream.

In 2009 I have been privileged to lead a high quality team of teachers and staff. Collectively this group of people are the significant point of difference that makes Forest View High School the secondary school of choice in our Tokoroa community. I acknowledge their commitment and the genuine desire that they possess to make a difference in the lives of students that attend our school. It is a privilege to work besides so many dedicated professionals who are unrelenting in their desire to improve student learning and raise achievement. Maori Achievement

Towards the end of 2008 the Forest View High School Māori Achievement Committee made a decision which was a significant change. The school traditionally held an end of year event to recognise and celebrate broad areas of Māori student achievement, such as academia, excellence in attendance, sport, culture, and leadership.

The academic focus of The Māori Education Strategy 2008-2012, Ka Hikitia challenged the committee to critically reflect on whether it was time to change the focus and the timing of the Māori Achievement celebration evening, and place a stronger focus on academic learning and the raising Māori academic achievement. The committee recognised that previous areas of recognition were important, but felt that existing school celebration events held towards the end of the year already acknowledged high Māori student performance in these areas. The committee also felt that moving the event to the beginning of the year increased its capacity to influence current Māori student performance.

After consulting with Mr Colin Tawhi, school kaumatua, and securing his support for the proposal, the committee remodelled the event for 2009. The criteria for recognition at the junior level were based on the school's Junior Certificate of Educational Achievement (JCEA, introduced in 2008, and at the senior level, the National Certificate of Educational Achievement. To be acknowledged were those who achieved at Merit and Excellence level in either JCEA or NCEA, and those who, in NCEA, exceeded the required number of credits by at least 25%. The deans were invited to identify a small number of other students, who had not reached these criteria but had worked with extreme diligence to achieve beyond expectations.

This process identified 45 Māori students out of a school roll of 380 Māori students who would be recognised at the evening.

Unsure of student and whānau support for the remodelled event, the school library was initially selected as the venue. However, this had to be moved to the school auditorium as acceptances from whānau to the personal written invitations indicated that at least 150 people would be attending. On the evening, over 200 people attended.

The committee made a key decision that to a large extent accounted for the overwhelming responses that they were receiving. This decision was to recognise not only the student, but also their iwi affiliations. It resulted in whānau responding to the school request to confirm the iwi that they wanted to be acknowledged with their son or daughter at the evening.

Previous student Newton Thompson, a recent graduate from the University of Otago, delivered a highly entertaining and relevant message as the guest speaker. Waiata and impromptu haka by other previous students contributed to his message that "as Māori there are no limits on what we as a people could achieve in the academic world."

Principal Richard Crawford commented that "the positive whānau and student feedback seem to indicate that the changes for 2009 have been positively embraced and over time the school will seek to imbed the event in to the culture of the school, to support our school community meet the ethos and the academic targets of Ka Hikitia."



My name is Sebastian P. Anastasiades from Denmark and I am here in New Zealand with AFS as an e change student. I have chosen to take a year out of my school to go to New Zealand. So I can learn about a new culture – Try a new school system – And make lots of friends. When I first arrived at my school (FVHS) I noticed that it looked nothing like the Danish schools. In Denmark we stay in one class room and the teacher will come to us instead of us going to them. So we don't have to rush from on

classroom to another (the teacher has too). But what I really like about the New Zealand schools is that they are not as stri as schools are in Denmark . You have more "Freedom" and you have a longer interval = there is a lot of interesting subjects such as Woodcarving and Photography. One of the biggest adjustments that I have had to make is that. I have to say miss ε sir to the teacher. While in Denmark you just call the teacher by their first name.

New Zealand schools also have a lot of different subjects that students can take. I was most surprised that they teach Wood carving, Art and Photography. Those subjects would no even be considered subjects in my country.

A thing about Denmark is that most of our teenagers and adults are smokers. And I am a smoker too. That really surprised when I got to New Zealand that almost none of the people are smokers. But since I am not allowed to smoke over here, I at trying to quit. I was on my first school trip some weeks ago and we went to Auckland. We were supposed to look at the differences between Rich and Poor people. So we were helping out in the Auckland city mission which was a great experience. Some of the things that I have really enjoyed are all the friends that I have made. The time I have had with my family, they have taken me a lot of places so I could see some of New Zealand such as Te Waihou walkway.

So far in my stay here in New Zealand, I have learned that I can survive without my parents help and appreciate new things that I didn't appreciate before.

AGRICULTURE





It has been a very eventful year for the Agriculture Academy students at Forest View. Some students have completed their National Certificate Level 2 and all have found a lot more about farming and its opportunities. Some students also took advantage of the opportunities offered in the Gateway programme. Students were involved in a number of social and training events.

Each year the school organises courses in practical farm skills. Students have learned to ride an ATV and motorbike although the trailer backing caused concerns for some. Tractor driving basic skills have been tackled and students have spent time outside honing their fencing skills ready for the big world. We have watched an autopsy on a calf done by Eddy from South Waikato Veterinary Services.

In April, a group of Agriculture students attended the Dairy3 "Big Day Off" event at The Red Barn, Piarere. This event was organised by DairyNZ for young farmers and those just starting out in the industry. Topics covered include bike maintenance, milk quality, budgeting, career paths and feed budgeting. The day was organised as an interactive event with groups rotated around each activity. During the day, "funny money" was handed out as a reward for involvement and at the close of the day an auction was held. Our students managed to purchase a variety of things including an MP3 player and socket set. It was a great event and well worth participation by those new to farming.

Two groups of students competed in an inter-schools competition at Ngatea and did very well by working together and planning activities.

June saw everyone off early to attend the National Fieldays to experience the wide variety of attractions there. Helping at the DaiyPush fieldays provides a variety of learning activities including parking management, ensured handouts are distribute, registered attendees, cooking the BBQ and cleaned up afterwards. Students also gained an insight into the programme and the business side of farming.

A number of students have taken advantage of the opportunities offered through Gateway to either learn farm skills or to gain credit for work they are already gainfully doing out of school.

During the year, we have been been lucky to add Mr Priscott to the staff in our classroom. We are also very fortunate to have the support of local farmers and other industry people who volunteer their time, expertise and workplaces to enable us to gain these extra skills. We are very grateful to the Tokoroa Host Lions Club for their on-going support which enables us to do a lot more for our students.



Automotive



Forest View High School has been operating its own Auto Shop since 1997 and is a fully accredited MITO (Motor Industry Training Organization) to deliver all Level One and Two /Unit Standards. We are also NZQA registered.

The workshop is run as a full year's programme giving students the chance to work on a range of engines and cars, and develop skills to gain Unit Standards for the trade.

We ran the MITO National Certificate in Foundation Skills Level 1 Start-Up programme that is design to take students through the foundation skills that are requirements required to enter the automotive industry as an apprentice. It enables the students to discover whether they want to go down the road of the automotive apprenticeship or look at different aspects of the industry.

Once the students have completed this section they then carry on to the National Certificate pre-entry to the automotive trade's level 2. This enables them to go into an

apprenticeship a lot easier and the time spent in a polytechnic will be reduced due to them gaining these Unit Standards.

The use of the workshop and classroom combination has enabled the students to do their theory as well as practical. This has made the explaining of theory on how engines work or operate a lot easier to teach as well as for them to understand how they work. The class room also makes as a great room for visiting speakers, who come and share about what is required for an apprenticeship, what bosses require from their workers and how their lives have been enriched within the automotive trade.


The activities undertaken in the auto shop enables the students to experience working with hand tools and equipment use in this trade.

The Automotive Industry is developing at a fast rate through the advancements in Technology, so the opportunities for specialized fields are many. This involves: Electronics-GPS, Radar, Tracking systems; Computers-Engine management, security, programming of engine systems; Design-developing cars of the future; Engine Reconditioning and development – racing cars, super stocks, marine just to name a few of the ever expanding industry...

The aim of the Auto Shop is to produce young students of both sexes to become top quality Automotive Mechanics, and Engineers whether it is in the fields of: Auto Machining, Panel beating, Car Grooming, Heavy Engineer, Tyre Fitter, Engine Reconditioner, Motor Cycle/Bike or Light Auto Mechanics.





This has been a busy year for the Careers Department as we continue to implement our CPaBL Career Education Plan that we developed last year.

As well as our 'in class' Careers education, the Year 12s visited Careers areas on their trip to Auckland and also went to Rotorua to the Careers Expo.

Careers Rapuara came to our school and spent the day delivering careers programme to our Maori students and also sent a rep to the Pacific Island fono to help PI parents with the careers service website.

During the year we have had reps from the various polytechs, unis and forces come to talk to our students. As part of subject selection for next year we held a Careers Evening here in August and this was attended by our local Polytechs, Universities, Forces and ITOs. This was a great success and the tertiary providers were very impressed by the number of students and parents who turned up to get help and information.


Oriental Wishes
