The depth of talent that we have at Forest View High School continues to impress me. I am immensely proud of the association and link that I have with the students of FVHS and I am excited about their readiness to meet the challenges that await them.

Through the month of October I was part of several panels that selected students to receive scholarships to assist them in the pursuit of further education. The high quality of applicants gave me a greater appreciation of the positive, confident, and culturally secure attitude that is evident in most of our Year 13 students. The students that we interviewed were proud of their school, absolutely proud of their town, and were determined to apply the qualities that have shaped who they are to scale the heights that they will encounter in 2011 and beyond.

Resilience, respect for oneself and others, the ability to adapt to change, to be confident in oneself and one's abilities, to be connected to communities, to become actively involved in the communities that we are part of, and to become a learner for life are some things that our school has highlighted as desirable qualities to be acquired in the 21st century. Our School RAP values encapsulate what we, as a school, seek to imbed within the value base and thinking of our students. To hear so many of our scholarship applicants refer to the school RAP values was assuring.

Student learning and student achievement is the core driver of all that we do at FVHS and in 2010 I was again privileged to lead the group of high quality teachers and support staff that we are fortunate to have as part of our school teaching team. As I have said in other public forums, it is my view that collectively this group of people are the significant point of difference that makes FVHS the top achieving secondary school in the South Waikato region. I acknowledge their commitment and the genuine desire that they possess to make a difference in the lives of the students that attend our school.

The key vehicle that we have identified in supporting our teachers to make the changes that are required to engage the learners of today more fully in their learning, is the partnership that we have formed with the University of Waikato — Te Kotahitanga. Although the programme focuses particularly on lifting our capacities as teachers to improve Maori student learning and achievement, we are finding that the enablers to achieve this are relevant to all students.

I thank our leadership team Mrs Chris Stokes, Miss Sandra Umaki, and Miss Sandy Taipeti for the leadership, passion, and drive that they have displayed in establishing a firm footing to build further development upon.

Thank you to our teachers who have responded so positively to the call for us to become more reflective of our practice and to model what we as teachers are asking our students to be – lifelong learners.

A quote from the Education Review Office's June 2010 publication, <u>Promoting success for Máori students: Schools' Progress</u>, sets the bar for which all schools in New Zealand are required to aspire:

"The impact of school practice on improving Máori success will be a critical factor in deciding the timing of each school's future review. ERO does not consider any school to be high performing unless the school can demonstrate that the majority of Máori learners are progressing well and succeeding as Máori (ERO, 2010, p 2)."

If we want to be considered a high performing school, it is imperative that we work together to close the gaps of achievement that currently exist between our Máori and Non Máori students. Research conducted in Te Kotahitanga Phase 3 and Phase 4 schools (have been in the programme between 3 and 7 years) shows that achievement for all students has improved.



I also acknowledge our Board of Trustees who are committed to making a difference to our students. I thank them for their efforts and I look forward to working with them to improve the quality of education that we are able to offer and that our students are able to access.

The high skill and knowledge base of our senior leadership team is a great strength of our school and assures me that improving student learning and raising achievement remains our central focus. As Principal I can rely on their vision, wise counsel, and unrelenting efforts to move our school forward. I thank them for the leadership that they consistently demonstrate.

My thanks to Miss Kelly Hack for her work as a teacher in our Social Sciences Department. Miss Hack has accepted a teaching position in Melbourne, Australia. I wish well in her new position. I also thank Mrs Adelle Sarich for the years of service that she has given to FVHS and the passion that she has displayed in working with both our students and our teachers. Mrs Ann Swanson is a long serving staff member, who is also leaving her role as a full time teacher of Hospitality and Catering. I acknowledge her for her efforts and thank her for the significant contribution that she has made to our school. I wish all three highly valued members of staff the best as they pursue their new pathways.

I encourage all of our students to make the most of the opportunities that are extended to them and to navigate their lives in the right direction. This direction is to be the best that they can be, in the educational pathway that they pursue. I trust and hope that our students will accept the responsibility to become leaders of their own lives and to strive for excellence in personal performance.



A good time was had by all and thank you to Mr Knight who made it all happen. I know everyone who went had a good time and learnt a lot. We will all cherish the experience.





TRACY CHUA FROM MALAYSIA

Kia ora, I am Tracy (Chua Sheng Ling). I'm from Malaysia and I'm Malaysian Chinese. Malaysia is a country located in Southeast Asia.



I lived in a small town, Tawau. My brother was a returnee from Argentina. It was interesting to hear about his experience and I realised the changes in him before he went and after he returned were really huge. I felt that it might be a good chance for me to experience more about the world and explore myself. I finished high school last year and I was actually quite confused about what I should do next. I decided to have a break before I continued on to University. NZ was my first choice because I love the natural environment here so much, and it is an English speaking country.

When I arrived at Auckland airport, I was a relieved because I was finally here, excited because a new life was waiting for me and worried because everything was different. I still remember when I was at the airport - all around me there were ENGLISH and TALL FOREIGNERS!!! Haha... It took me a few weeks to adjust the environment. Kiwis speak really fast English. Sometimes when I got tired to ask or listen in classes, I used to pretend I understood, but actually I didn't. Hehe... Luckily, it's getting better.

Of course school is different too. Lots of people have asked me, do I enjoy study in NZ or in Malaysia more. For me I like both and they are totally different. I like FVHS because the school provides lots of chances and opportunities for students to discover their talent and potential. But, I don't really like the college style changing periods though, it is just my personal problem. I'm very bad with direction and I always got lost at school in the first two months. I found that study here is the most relaxed school life I've ever had. Haha... School life in Malaysia is kinda hectic. Normally we start school at 6.55am, and then finish at 1.20pm or 2pm from Monday to Saturday. Every day, we have at least 9 periods. We have to take about 8-12 subjects for exams and there are about 5 extra non-examination subjects that are compulsory. On Friday or Saturday, we have to attend our co-curriculum sections. My school has 7 societies and more that about 30 clubs (sports and art clubs). We stay in the same class thoughout the day, and every period we have the same 50 classmates but different teachers. But we always have activities with other classes, so we are pretty close to everyone.

There are many fun activities in FVHS though. I liked the sports day when everyone dressed in their lake colours and some of them had funny outfits. The Production weeks, everyone worked hard on stage and laughed together backstage. My first Poly dance was awkward but fun. In my music class, I thought 'How lucky kiwi kids are!'. Our music class back home is just sing along and that's it. Here I got lots of chances to do performances and gain experience.

I feel sad and regretful that I didn't try to get into sports. If I got a chance to start again, I might join sports too. Although I'm not the sporty type, at least I know the feeling of being hit by a ball or a twisted leg. LOL~ (^ u ^)

My AFS experience has been absolutely priceless. Even though I had a hard time in the middle of my stay, I still learnt a lot from that. I have so much love for my family and friends that I never realised. I kept comparing and complaining about how my life was until I realised how lucky I am. I always made a big fuss over a minor issue or I was easily upset when things went out of my control. But now I've learned to stay calm and be mature. It is hard to change your surroundings rather than changing your attitude. Everything has their good and bad sides, it depends how you find the balance point. Problems might be easier to solve when you face them. It is hard to tell what I learned this year. Did I change to a better person? I'm not too sure, but I think I am more complete by learning who I am. =)

GERMI NARDELLI FROM ARGENTINA

Hi I'm Germi. I'm 17 years old, and I'm from Argentina . I chose to take a year out of my school and go on



an AFS exchange because I wanted to have a relaxing year and meet new people and see new places and understand the cultures in another country.

My first impression of NZ was that everything was clean and green. Very different from where I came from. In the beginning I was worried about how difficult it was going to be to get friends and get good at English. What I think now is that I did well and I don't have worries or difficulties any more.

The major differences between my school and FVHS are: the size of the schools in Argentina are smaller because most of them are in the city centre. We can't choose the subjects we do. You have to take 14 compulsory subjects for the year. But, in the last 3 years it is like years 11,12 and 13 here. You can choose the types of subjects like Business, Humanities (exchange; Languages, Art etc) and Sciences but they still have 14 subjects each. We start the school at 7:30 and we finish at 1:00 but there are 3 intervals; 2 of 10 min and 1 of 15 min. We have Computers and P.E in the afternoon 2 times each week. We also have 1 hour of homework or study for exams every day.

FVHS has given me the opportunity to play soccer in a school team, people have included me and treated me like all the other students and and I've been involved in other things like the competition between the Lakes. That I really enjoyed.

I think that this experience taught me to grow up, helped me to become a better person and know about another culture. It brought me friends, a new language and I feel proud of myself.

CAITLIN WHITFORD HOME FROM JAPAN こんにちは、私の名前はケイト リンです。今年の三月、日本に 行きました。



Hey, I'm Caitlin! This year I was lucky enough to receive a language scholarship, which allowed me to live in Japan for 5 months. On the 24th of March I was off to spend 5 months of my life in a small city called Omihachiman, on the other side of the world.

12 hours after leaving my family and friends, I landed in Tokyo. From Tokyo we had a 12-hour bus ride to Osaka for orientation camp. For the first few days it still hadn't really sunk in that I was actually there in Japan. Three days later and I was off to meet my host family. My family was so cool and sweet. I had a 7-year-old sister who was completely adorable and a 12-year-old brother which was very different as I only have a sister.

1 week later and I found myself riding, alone, to school in a skirt with a tie, blouse and blazer on, with my bag in the basket and hoping like hell I wouldn't get lost. When I finally arrived at school everywhere I looked there was a sea of black hair and I couldn't tell anybody apart. Let me tell you, I stood out a mile! I will never forget the day I was riding to school and some crazy Japanese man jumped out in front of me and made me stop just so he could ask to take a photo of my blonde hair.

School in Japan was completely different to school here in New Zealand. School started at 8.00 every morning and we had 7 or 8 periods a day! Everyday there were clubs after school, which every student had joined. I joined the Koto (Japanese Harp) Club and Kyudo (Japanese Archery) Club and during the summer holidays I played soccer with the Soccer Club. I had practice every day after school and usually it wouldn't finish until 7.00 at night.



Hi, I'm Helen and I've been on an exchange in the Netherlands for about 8 and a half months now. I live on a dairy farm with an awesome host family, and



I have had many experiences here that I never would have had if I had stayed in New Zealand. In my first week I walked 40 minutes out into the middle of a frozen lake to see giant ice waves caused by the wind!!! — Something I just couldn't imagine before I came. I've been to Amsterdam, my favourite city, MANY times, and every time I go I find something new and interesting. Although it's all put on for the tourists, Amsterdam amplifies everything Holland is liberal about and it's really mind opening. Although it wasn't very pleasant, I went to a concentration camp, and it's an experience I will never forget. You really start to think when you are standing where thousands of people have been murdered for no just cause.

My exchange has not always been easy though. I had to change host families and that was a very difficult decision to make as

I've met so many great people this year, and not only have I come away with international contacts; and another language, I've had to experience and understand the Dutch culture, and I've learnt about many other cultures from other exchange students, and I've realised things about my own country and culture that I didn't understand before.

I've had a great exchange so far, I've learnt so many things I couldn't possibly have learnt in a classroom, and with only a couple of months to go I know it will continue to be great.

ASHLEIGH TOTTON IN ITALY

After working very hard with her family here to raise the finances for her AFS experience Ashleigh left in late August to spend six months in a small town

in northern Italy near the mountains and close to the Austrian border.

She lives with her host family, (Mum and Dad who only speak a little English along with a brother and sister are at home but she has another host sister who is in NZ on AFS at the moment).

Each day she travels 40 minutes to school. The school day begins at 8.00am and finishes at 1.30pm. The students take 12 subjects, stay in one room all day and the teachers come to them. Three days a week after school she goes to Italian lessons and she feels her language skills are really improving. She also attends contemporary dance lessons which she is enjoying.

Each day there is a cooked lunch and dinner, (this is like 2 courses of pasta and meat). She enjoys the Italian lasagne and loves their chocolate cake which she's learned to make. She's not so sure about the bread and pizza there though.

Already time is flying by so she is trying hard to make the most of her opportunity.

At around 4.30 we arrived in Japan. After an eleven hour flight we were all excited to walk around and get feeling back in our legs.





Thank you to Cath O'Connell, our Gateway co-ordinator and the staff in school who supported this programme.


















SCRAPHEAP CHALLENGE
