Uniform Shop:

The uniform shop at Forest View High School is the only place you are able to buy our school uniform. All existing students in Year 11 through to Year 13 may continue to wear the old uniform. All Year 9 and 10 students and new students to the school will need to purchase the new uniform - no Year 9 or Year 10 students are allowed to wear the old school hoodies.

In 2021 if you would like to wear a Jacket to school regardless of the year level you are in it must be the new school uniform jacket, all other jackets will be confiscated.

Both uniforms allow students to wear plain black shoes (no coloured logos) and plain black socks or sandals. Jandals are not permitted and covered footwear must be worn in all Technology classes.

Uniform cannot be charged to your school accounts (unless you have a credit balance), it must be paid for at the time of purchase - EFTPOS is available.

We would advise you purchase as much as possible at the beginning of the year while the prices are cheaper. We do not sell large quantities of stationery but we do have a small number of supplies for students to purchase some top up items.

Students will complete some of their learning on Chromebooks as well as in written form.

Blanket Consent Form:

Enclosed is a blanket consent form for you to complete and return to the school no later than the 15th of February. This form will stop us from having to get consent from you for trips into and around town that are low risk (e.g. do not include things like swimming). Your help with completing this and returning it would be much appreciated.

Birth certificate / Passport / Immunisation verification:

It is a Ministry of Education requirement that we hold a copy of either a birth certificate or Passport to verify the immigration status of our students. All Year 9, new students and those who have not provided a copy previously will need to provide us with this, we are happy to copy these for you if original documents come into school.

Please also let us know **if your child has not been vaccinated.** This will be added to their record in our student database.

Fees and Charges:

In 2021 we have decided to once again be part of the Ministry of Education scheme for schools to opt into for donations. This means we cannot charge you for items where there is not a take home component or where things are compulsory for students to be part of. Camps, Sports and other non-compulsory trips and non-compulsory work or exam preparation books can be charged for. Please carefully read any information from teachers about the costs involved in the subjects your students are choosing. We will ask you to sign and return forms agreeing to pay these costs prior to your student being accepted into these courses, trips or sports teams.

The easiest way to pay for your child's school costs is by way of automatic payment. Payments can be made to the following account:

Even a payment of \$10 per week, if possible, makes a big difference to keeping on top of the costs involved in secondary schooling.

If you are ever in financial hardship we encourage you to please come in and speak with a staff member you are comfortable with and we can make arrangements for you. Our first priority is always to have students able to participate in activities.

Students will not be able to play sports for our school unless the fees are paid or an arrangement made prior to the season beginning.

What is Akoranga?

Akoranga is an opportunity for students to try out new things and to not be under pressure with gaining credits from this subject. The classes are mixed with students from all year levels. What is Arataki?

Arataki is similar to a Tutor time but is much more intensive. Arataki teachers are your first port of call in the school for any concerns or questions about your child. They will have a complete handle on your child's learning, goals and careers aspirations. Arataki teachers will be in regular contact with you and during interviews you will meet with them. You are always welcome to contact subject teachers also at any time by email or making an appointment to see them. We like to call our Arataki teachers the Champions of our students.

This is a new system for you to be part of and we will guide you through this to make sure you are able to track your own progress and be successful. The NCEA examination schedule is published at the end of this section so you have some idea when the external exams will be held. Please note though not all students sit NCEA external exams.

You may have heard in the media that NCEA is going through some changes over the next few years. These changes may not affect your year level as 2021 is the trial year and we have chosen not to be part of the trial of the new system.
