Welcome to our Forest View High School 2022 Student Information Pack

We are looking forward to the 2022 school year and welcoming you either back to school or into our school whanau.

There is much for us to celebrate in 2022 with our NCEA results across all year levels being higher than previous years and our school performing well in relation to schools our size and decile. Our theme for 2022 will be that of consolidation - we will be ensuring all that we have changed over the last three years is embedded firmly into the work we are doing as a school. We have taken into consideration the feedback we received from our school community and have made a few tweaks to our daily operations while keeping the idea of modern education running through Forest View High School.

2022 will see a yearly plan for Arataki shared with all students and whanau. This will also be a time where there is more accountability and the sessions are not only linked to the Arataki teacher being the champion for each student but also responsible for ensuring they are progressing through the new learning pathways in Arataki. Arataki for all students is the largest allocation of time which shows how much we value this time and our desire for all students to be connected and have a time for mentoring, career planning and a range of other valuable life skills and learning.

In 2022 we will begin using our school values of Connected, Courageous and Community as a method of working together for all students and staff. These will be built into the daily routines and functions of our school. We look forward to this work beginning and celebrating the successes of both staff and students on this learning journey.

2022 will also see a number of renovations continue around our school with a refurbishment of our Auditorium finally able to get underway. The entire space will have a change which means it will be out of action from the end of January until the project is finished. We will make alternative arrangements for hosting large events while we cannot use the auditorium. We will hold an opening for the community to see our new space once it has been altered.

We welcome some new staff to our school and I know you will all make them feel welcome. Remember that teachers and other staff are nervous about starting in a new school just as much as students are. The advantage of our school is we are small and like getting to know all of our students. We look forward to seeing you thrive in your education this year.

2022 sees us continuing to offer free lunches to all students. This is a great programme and we are so happy to be part of it and to have such an amazing team working in this area. As always our lunches are made on site with 2022 seeing us make lunches for Amisfield School, David Henry School and also Strathmore School.

FVHS Uniform

The uniform shop at Forest View High School is the only place you are able to buy our school uniform. All existing students in Year 12 and Year 13 may continue to wear the old uniform - no one else may. All Year 9, 10, 11 and new students to the school will need to purchase the current uniform. We are actively discouraging the old school hoodies and no Year 9,10 or 11 students are permitted to wear these at all.

There will be a tightening up across the school of non uniform items so we suggest you purchase new uniform items prior to school starting. If your child has grown out of their current uniform and it is in good condition we have some uniforms we may be able to swap these with. Please ask at the uniform shop.

Both uniforms allow students to wear plain black shoes (no coloured logos) and plain black socks or sandals. Jandals are not permitted and covered footwear must be worn in all Technology classes.

Students can wear any combination of this uniform. The blazers are available for anyone who wants to buy them, the shorts are also for girls if they wish. PE tops and shorts are only to be worn in PE. There are no winter/summer combinations or anything specific for any year levels.

Please note that as a school we are not making a profit on the uniform items, we are literally covering our costs and keeping the uniform as affordable as possible.

Blanket Consent Form / Health Form / Emergency Contacts

Enclosed is a blanket consent form for you to complete and return to the school no later than the <u>15th of February</u> if you have not completed one in the last year. This form will stop us from having to get consent from you for trips into and around town that are low risk (e.g. do not include things like swimming). Your help with completing this and returning it would be much appreciated.

Each year we are required to update the Health information and Emergency contacts for all students. Please complete the required forms to help us with this process.

Birth Certificate / Passport / Immunisation Verification

It is a Ministry of Education requirement that we hold a copy of either a birth certificate or Passport to verify the immigration status of our students. All Year 9, new students and those who have not provided a copy previously will need to provide us with this, we are happy to copy these for you if original documents come into school.

If you need a verified copy of any of these documents we are also happy to help you with this.

Please also let us know <u>if your child has not been vaccinated.</u> This will be added to their record in our student database.

COVID Vaccinations

As you will be aware all students are able to attend school regardless of their vaccination status. Schools are not required to hold COVID vaccination information but we can do so if you wish to provide this for us.

We however have to let you know that we have already been notified that students who are not vaccinated and do not have a vaccination pass will not be able to attend certain venues, functions, events or play sport. Please remember that we have not made these rules, we are simply following the mandate that has been given to us.

We have already made the decision to ensure that we will be able to hold our school ball that we will only be having students who attend our school present and we will run the entire event without any outsiders - this should then mean we are acting in a manner similar to a normal school day. Vaccination status of students and the gathering rules should not apply to the ball then. We apologise for the inconvenience this will cause to those wanting to bring outside partners but we are sure you will understand we are making decisions which we think will best fit each event.

Fees and Charges

In 2022 we have decided to once again be part of the Ministry of Education scheme for schools to opt into for donations. This means we cannot charge you for items where there is not a take home component or where things are compulsory for students to be part of.

Camps, Sports and other non-compulsory trips and non-compulsory work or exam preparation books can be charged for. Please carefully read any information from teachers about the costs involved in the subjects your students are choosing. We will ask you to sign and return forms agreeing to pay these costs prior to your student being accepted into these courses, trips or sports teams.

Even a payment of \$10 per week, if possible, makes a big difference to keeping on top of the costs involved in secondary schooling.

If you are ever in financial hardship we encourage you to please come in and speak with a Deputy Principal and we can make arrangements for you. Our first priority is always to have students able to participate in activities.

Students will not be able to play sports for our school unless the fees are paid or an arrangement made prior to the season beginning.

Learning at Forest View High School and Timetable Structure

We are proud of the way we have reimagined our timetable and use the time within a week to challenge students to learn in multiple ways and to have a champion who mentors them.

We have broken our week up into 1500 minutes, into blocks of 300 minutes per day. We have 100 minute learning sessions each day in the morning prior to Interval and then on all days except Wednesday another 100 minute lesson before lunch. After lunch there are two 50 minute learning sessions prior to the end of the day. 100 minute sessions may seem like they are a long time but with teachers differentiating their lessons and breaking the lessons into various activities etc these are the most preferred length of time for teaching. The longer times are really helpful for all of our practical based subjects e.g Workshop subjects, Art etc.

Our Senior students choose five subjects and they have 200 minutes per subject. This is more than enough subjects to gain NCEA, endorsements and University Entrance through Approved subjects. Each subject provides the ability for students to gain a subject endorsement should they choose this for both semesters. This is on top of Arataki and Akoranga. Both Arataki and Akoranga are learning times - they are just not subject specific learning times e.g. Maths, English. Students are able to gain credits through the learning that takes place in both Akoranga and Arataki . No subjects are compulsory for students to choose in Year 11, 12 or 13. The subjects chosen should be based on possible future career pathways. If these are not known as would often be the case in Year 11 a broad programme of study would be encouraged. If students are clear about their future pathways as they should be more so at Year 13 then more specific subjects should be chosen to meet the career needs e.g. to be accepted into Medical School you would generally need to take all of the Sciences Senior students are also able to change their subjects over at the end of the semester. This would be ideal for someone who does not want to sit externals in a subject or who wants to try a new subject for the second part of the year. The Kaitiaki and Arataki teachers talk through career pathways before the new subjects are selected for the second semester. Parents / caregivers / whanau are always welcome to be part of these discussions.

Junior students have 7 subjects which each run for 150 minutes per week. This is to allow them to experience a wider range of subjects so they understand what each is about before specialising more in the senior years. All Junior students also have Arataki and Akoranga each week as well as a period dedicated to their Junior Certificate of Learning. This session will enable them to work on the community, movement and Literacy and Numeracy parts of their JCL. Further information will be provided to students at the beginning of 2022 about how this session works. Junior students are all placed in a mixed ability core class where the teachers will differentiate the learning to meet the needs of all students.

Junior Students have two option lines where they will complete rotations of subjects. One of these is compulsory and contains Languages (Samoan, Te Reo Maori and Cook Island Maori) Te Ao Maori and Drama. The other one contains Digital Technology, Materials Technology, Art, Music and Food and students choose which options they would like to take.


The rationale behind these option lines is that by the time students get to high school they will already have tried the optional subjects in technology classes or as part of their general classroom education. Specific language learning and drama classes are not usually able to be taught before high school so these are compulsory.

We are delighted to provide students with a wide range of taught subjects including Physics, Statistics, Chemistry as well as Outdoor Education through to Languages. For a small school this is something we have strived to ensure we can continue to offer. If there is a subject that cannot fit into the timetable or cannot be staffed for some reason we offer this through Te Kura where students have a teacher from outside our school teaching this subject to them.

Below are the subject lines and how the week works for students. Junior students will be in a core class and will follow around their class.

Option lines for Year 9 are in the following lines: Languages / Te Ao Maori / Drama (Line 2), Arts/Technology (students can choose) (Line 4).


Option lines for Year 10 are in the following lines: Languages / Te Ao Maori / Drama (Line 1), Arts/ Technology (students can choose) (Line 5).



Junior Certificate of Learning

At the beginning of 2021 we introduced a Junior Certificate of Learning for all Year 9 and 10 Students. Credits are gained across all your subjects to gain an Achieved, Merit and Excellence Certificate. There will also be a further range of awards on offer on top of this which your Arataki teacher will help you apply for which include contribution to community, sports and cultural activities participation. This further tier will allow you to gain Bronze, Silver and Gold Junior Certificate of Learning awards.

Arataki teachers will provide more detailed information to explain how this works across all your classes.



<u>Senior Students have course confirmation days on the 1st</u>, <u>2nd and 3rd of February</u> where they need to confirm their classes for the year. There have been some changes since they made their first selections. Year 13 will complete their course confirmation at their Year 13 Induction day on the 1st of February. All Year 13 students need to attend this too!

What is Akoranga?

Akoranga occurs most Wednesday of the year from 11am to 3pm. This is a combined learning time where students from Year 9 to 13 are able to choose an option they are interested in. This allows for a Tuakana-Teina model of learning where students from all Year levels can mix together and learn together. It may be the older students teaching the younger or the younger teaching the older.

The time is a structured learning time with a clear plan of the programme and expected outcomes at the end of the time period. In 2022 we will introduce some showcases of the learning that has taken place - we will invite in parents / caregivers and whanau to view these.

We have made some changes to Akoranga for 2022 including the following (thank you for all the feedback we received):

- The appointment of a new Assistant Principal Cherie Merrylees-Clarke who is responsible for Akoranga. We have not had a person in our Senior team solely responsible for this previously. This will involve checking all teacher planning, checking on the day the lessons match the planning and ensuring there is rigour to this programme.
- Students will now choose a new Akoranga subject every Term instead of this being run for a Semester.
- Some of the offerings in the past cannot be run unless they have a final product at the end of them e.g. Gaming must now include some form of measurement to show progress e.g. Building of a Minecraft city etc
- Akoranga will be included in our reporting to families.

Akoranga is an opportunity for students to try out new things and to not be under pressure with gaining credits from this subject. If achievement naturally falls out of the learning then students will be awarded with this, if not there are other goals that can be set e.g. for the Walking / Tramping group it could be the students are able to walk more difficult pathways than at the beginning of the term and have increased their fitness levels.

We are always looking for a mixture of student interest and staff being able to offer suitable programmes for Akoranga. Food is a great example here where a student may not take this subject as it does not fit into their career plan but they have a passion for cooking. This allows them in their week to still be able to complete some learning in this area. Study is always an option for senior students.

During 2020 and 2021 we have run Golf, Walking, Swimming, Wearable Arts, Whakairo, Evolocity, Mural painting, Pacific Costuming, Sports, League, Rugby, Swimming, Traditional Card and Board games, Adventure sports, etc

During the first weeks of 2022 we will use Wednesday Akoranga time for Lake activities and a range of other activities we usually engage in to avoid other class interruptions. Akoranga for 2022 begins on the 16th of March.

What is Arataki?

The key concept behind Arataki is to ensure that all of our students belong to the Forest View High School community, they are connected to a person who is their champion in all aspects of school life. This happens through having key people in the school who care for you, know you and celebrate your successes. Likewise they will also let you know when you need to be better and together you set goals to achieve for the year.

Arataki is part of the holistic well being of our young people. We have a responsibility to ensure that when our students leave us they are not only educated (have gained as many qualifications as possible) but they have the soft skills required to be successful in life. These skills include understanding how to run their personal finances, how to navigate the world of drugs and alcohol, how to work alongside other to achieve a team goal, how to make phone calls, have a bank account and IRD number, understand how tax works and also know how to access help from the services in the community. All of these skills are taught in Arataki.

Arataki is a block of time (300 minutes for Seniors) and 200 minutes for Juniors that is specifically at the beginning of the day with the person that should know the students the most. This enables them to not only provide the above life skills but to check in on them to ensure there are no pastoral issues to follow up. All students use MyMahi a computer based programme for tracking the mentoring and goal setting. This also holds their student ID and can move through all year levels and after school with students with all of their information on it including a CV and other useful employment related information.

The days of running a tutor time for students to check the roll and read out notices is relating back to an old out of date education system. Students are more than this these days and the world we are preparing them for and already living in is very different to the one where we would have maybe seen students for 10 minutes a day and maybe knew them or simply knew their name. Students are needing much more connection now as they enter a disconnected electronic world. Many students struggle to relate to others face to face, are petrified of making a phone call or asking someone a question face to face. Arataki class is where we can address some of these issues and always push students to be braver than they think they can be. While the overall concept of Arataki may be a different or new one to you, be assured it is learning time and it is important for teenagers to have this time allocated to them. We carefully track the time used in Arataki and there is a group of Year Level Kaitikai and Jason Jowett who plan and monitor the time in Arataki and how it is used.

Each Arataki class is year level specific and lake based e.g. 11 Whakamaru, 12 Arapuni etc. Arataki time is also used for Lake assemblies, Year level assemblies, whole school assemblies, guest speakers, Tertiary providers to visit. Using Arataki as the time for all of these events avoids us interrupting the core classes for students.

Arataki teachers are your main and first contact with the school and they will be in touch with you regularly.

If you could bring along a pen with you that would be great - everything else will be supplied to you. We will provide morning tea following the powhiri and lunch will also be provided for you. The only other students at school on this day with you will be the Year 13 students - they will welcome you to our school with a tour and some activities. Your day will finish at 2pm.

Don't be nervous! We will look after you well.

What to do if there is a problem or you are worried about something?

The first person you will talk to is your Arataki teacher. If you are sick you will come to Student Services and the staff will be able to help you with any problems you have. We will introduce you to everyone on your first day here.

We have access to a school Nurse - Liz John and a doctor as well as Guidance Counsellor, Alcohol and Drug counsellors and a range of other services students may require.

In order to do this you will need to gain 10 Numeracy credits, 10 Literacy credits and 60 other credits at Level 1 or above. This is a new system for you to be part of and we will guide you through this to make sure you are able to track your own progress and be successful. NCEA will require some of you to sit external exams and practice exams before that - we will explain this to you at the beginning of the year so you understand NCEA. We want you to gain the highest level of NCEA possible rather than just settling for an Achieved standard so we will be pushing you to gain overall endorsement and subject endorsements where we think this is possible and achievable.

NCEA student progress is tracked on the staffroom wall for all staff to celebrate your successes and work together to help you achieve. The 2022 Examination Timetable for current NCEA standards and New Zealand Scholarship will run from Monday 7 November until Friday 2 December.

Student Vehicles

Permission to bring your own vehicle to school will be required by completing a registration form signed by your parents, yourself and one of our Deputy Principals - Kathy McGovern or Aaron Mutua. A copy of your driver's licence will be kept on file also.

If you drive with passengers in your car without the appropriate licence or leave school during the day with other students we will contact the police to inform them of this and also you will lose the permission to bring your car to school. Student car parking will be behind Student Services. The area behind the gym is out of bounds.

School Bus Arrangements for 2022

2022 will see some minor changes to our school transport as the Ministry of Education transitions to a new contract with our current bus operators. To make sure that the start of the school year goes as smoothly as possible, please familiarise yourself with the information below:

Eligibility for school transport assistance

We often get questions about whether students qualify for school transport assistance i.e., a place on a school bus. The Ministry of Education has three criteria that students must meet in order to qualify for school transport assistance. They are:

- 1. The student must attend their closest state or state-integrated school
- 2. The student must live at least 4.8km from school
- 3. There must be no suitable public transport options

Responsibility of caregivers

To ensure a safe environment for bus loading and unloading caregivers should: not park in bus bays, adhere to the speed limit (20 km/h while passing a stationary school bus on either side of the road), try to eliminate the need for children to cross the road ensure that children get to and from the bus stop safely

Please note: if you currently have a private arrangement with your bus operator, you will need to contact your bus operator to confirm that your arrangement will continue in 2022.
